Panthera Supporting Clinical Research

Patient Clinic Journey

Step 1

- When patients are eligible to enrol on to a study via a telescreen questionnaire, they are invited in to their local Panthera Clinic where patients are asked for their written consent to participate in a medical health review. These take place with a qualified Research Physician or Research Nurse.
- The medical health review includes taking the patient's height, weight, BMI, temperature, blood pressure, heart rate and blood test. Dependent on the study, other checks such as a fibroscan or ECG may also take place. All results are shared with the patient's GP Practice.

Step 2

- If the patient is found suitable to participate in the study, the local Panthera clinic will request a Source Data Verification (SDV) Questionnaire from their GP.
- Once the SDV is completed and returned, the patient can begin their clinical trial journey. Although all study duration periods vary, the patient and Practice will be made aware of how long the trial they have enrolled on to is approximated to last.

Step 3

- If the patient proceeds with the study, they will be invited back for visits dependant on the clinical trial and may have more tests during the study.
- All findings of the study will be shared with their GP.
