### **Changing Perceptions of Disability**

Sunderland People First and Autism in Mind are delighted to announce that we have secured funding from the Fourteen programme to organise a range of events in the East area of Sunderland around 'improving perceptions towards people with disabilities'. Fourteen is administered by the Community Foundation Tyne & Wear and Northumberland and funded in partnership with Sunderland City Council, the Community Foundation and Spirit of 2012; who established the programme from the legacy of the 2014 Commonwealth Games and the London 2012 Olympics and Paralympics.
