





- General Dementia condition information and how to obtain a diagnosis
- Money Matters and Legal Affairs
- What to expect from health and social care services
- How to obtain an Adult Needs Assessment

- Signposting to other organisations that can help
- Supported Living and Residential/Nursing Homes
- Accessing support as a carer including a Statutory Carers Assessment
- Equipment and daily living requirements
