If you think this has happened then the person at the Safe Place will have to **report** it to the Police.

What is the Safe Places Scheme?



Everybody should be able to go out and about and feel safe in their community

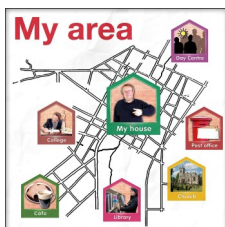


The **Safe Place Scheme** can help you if you ever feel worried or scared or need a bit of extra help.



You might need support if:

- You are lost
- You have lost something like your wallet
- Someone has stolen something from you
- Someone is bullying you



There are lots of places in and around Sunderland that you can go if you need help. This could be a shop, café or community centre.



You will know they are a **Safe Place** if they have this logo in their window

Getting Help at a Safe Place:



If you feel worried, frightened, bullied or in danger go into any building with a Safe Place sticker.



Show your **Safe Places Card** to the staff in the Safe Place. Your Safe Place card will have contact details for someone you can trust like a carer or support worker.



The person in the Safe Place can help you by making a telephone call or giving you advice.



Remember, if you don't have a card on you, you can still ask for help at the Safe Place
