## **Pharmacy First**

Help us, help you! Community pharmacies can offer treatment for seven common conditions without patients needing to see a GP, as part of a major transformation in the way the NHS delivers care. Highly trained pharmacists at more than nine in ten pharmacies can now access and treat patients for earache, impetigo, infected insect bites, shingles, sinusitis, sore throat, urinary tract infections (UTIs) for women aged 16-64 - without the need for a GP appointment. Available on the high-street, community pharmacy teams have the right clinical training to give people the health advice they need, with no appointment necessary and private consultations available. Community pharmacists will signpost patients to other local services where necessary. By expanding the services community pharmacies offer, the NHS is aiming to help free up GP appointments and give people more choice in how and where they access care. Do you know about the Whooping Cough Vaccine? You can now protect your unborn baby from Whooping Cough with the Pertussis vaccination. This is best given between 16- & 32weeks' gestation and is highly effective as the immunity passes through the placenta to your baby. ## **Covid Vaccines**

You may be offered a spring COVID -19 vaccine from April 2024 if you are; Aged 75 old or over. Live in a care home Are aged 6 months or over and have a weakened immune system. We will be contacting patients as soon as we get delivery dates for the vaccine and set clinic's up.

## **Holiday Vaccinations**

We ask that patients let us know with 6-8 weeks' notice so that we can make sure there is an appointment available & stock of the vaccinations needed. Not all vaccinations are available free of charge on the NHS, and you may need to go to an Independent Travel Clinic instead. The practice can supply you with a print-out of your current immunisation status to help you to do this. Please see reception staff if you are going abroad and think you may need to be vaccinated.

## MMR

Measles Vaccinations: MMR (measles, mumps and rubella) vaccine: You may have seen reports in the Press recently, about the sharp increase in Measles infections – almost double in a year. This has been attributed to a reduction in vaccination rates and this has now led to a rush to get children vaccinated. The MMR vaccine is a safe and effective combined vaccine. It protects against 3 serious illnesses: Measles, Mumps and Rubella (German Measles) Measles is a highly infectious condition that starts with cold-like symptoms, followed by a rash a few days later. It affects the respiratory tract and can then lead to complications that can include chest and ear infections, diarrhoea, or encephalitis (infection of the brain) and maybe hospitalisation. Getting vaccinated against all Measles infections is very important, as these conditions can also lead to serious problems including Meningitis, hearing loss and problems during pregnancy. It is very contagious can spread easily between unvaccinated people – usually children. If missed, 2 doses of the MMR vaccine, which can be given at any age, will provide the best protection against measles, mumps, and rubella. For further information, you can ask your GP surgery or other healthcare professionals for when children should have the MMR vaccine. The MMR vaccine is given to babies and young children as part of the NHS vaccination schedule. MMR Vaccine Schedule Child's Age Vaccine 1 Year MMR – 1 st Dose 3Years and 4 Months MMR – 2 nd Dose Important: Missed vaccines. It's important to catch up on any missed vaccines. You can still ask your GP surgery for the MMR vaccine if your child has missed either of these 2 doses.
