## NHS Right to choose referrals

Did you know that in many cases you have the legal right to choose where you have your NHS treatment? The NHS is offering more and more options to enable you to make choices that best suit your circumstances, giving you greater control of your care, and hopefully better results.

How to request a right to choose referral:

- You will first need to research and choose a service that you would like to be referred to. Their website's will also explain how to ask for a referral from you GP and if there are any documents you will need to complete in order to be referred.
- Then arrange an appointment with your GP and ask them to refer you.
- The GP will then complete the referral for you to your chosen service.

What is pharmacy first? Pharmacy First enables community pharmacists to supply prescription-only medicines, including antibiotics and antivirals where clinically appropriate, to treat seven common health conditions without the need to visit a GP.

What are the seven common conditions Sinusitis, Sore throat, Earache, Infected insect bite, Impetigo, Shingles, Uncomplicated urinary tract infections.

How can I access treatment from my pharmacy? You can access treatment by walking into the pharmacy or contacting them virtually. Your GP receptionists can also send same day referrals to your chosen pharmacy.

#### **Measles Vaccination Catch Up Campaign**

You may be aware that there have been reports of widespread measles outbreaks in areas across the country. While there is not currently a specific outbreak in Leeds, you may wish to catch up on missing vaccines. All children and adults are eligible for the vaccine on a catch-up basis. However, vaccine might be contraindicated for some people who may be immuno-suppressed. Please contact reception to confirm your current MMR vaccination status if you are unsure.

Symptoms of measles are: Fever AND rash AND one of runny nose OR cough OR conjunctivitis that last for 2-4 days or up to a week. It's very unlikely to be measles if you've had both doses of the MMR vaccine or you've had measles before. Anyone with suspected measles should stay away from school or work for at least 4 days, rest and take pain relief as needed. They should avoid contact with young babies and anyone who is immuno-suppressed or pregnant.

#### **Accident and Emergency in Leeds**

Leeds General Infirmary - Postcode: LS2 9DA. The Emergency Department is on the Ground Floor, Jubilee Wing

St James's Hospital - Postcode: LS9 7TF. The Emergency Department is on the Ground Floor, Chancellors Wing

The Leeds Children's Emergency Department is in the Jubilee Wing at Leeds General Infirmary. There is no Emergency Department for children under 16 years old at St James's University Hospital

#### **Urgent treatment centres in Leeds**

Open everyday from 8am -11pm (including bank holidays including Christmas Day). Do not treat people aged under two years old or those aged over 65 who have a head injury. They also do not treat people with pregnancy related health conditions. Before attending an urgent treatment centre, you must call NHS 111 or the centre directly. You will initially be given a remote consultation and then informed when to attend in order to maintain social distancing.

There are currently two urgent treatment centres in Leeds:

St George's Urgent Treatment Centre, St George's Centre, St George's Road, Middleton, LS10 4UZ

Wharfedale Urgent Treatment Centre, Wharfedale Hospital, Newall Carr Road, Otley, LS21 2LY
