## TIME TO TAKE YOUR LUNGS FOR AN MOT?

Our GP Practice has been selected to take part in an NHS pilot service checking lung health. If you are aged 55-74 and you currently, or have ever been a regular smoker, you can have a free lung health check. Run by specially trained nurses, a lung health check can spot any problems early and any treatment could be simpler and more successful. Our clinics will run from June to August and we will be writing to patients aged 55-74 with further information.

### JOIN THE PARKRUN FAMILY

Our Practice has recently registered as a parkrun practice, linking with the Nostell and Frickley parkruns. Walk, jog, run, volunteer or simply go along and watch. #### **CANCER SCREENING**

We are delighted to be involved in the Wise Up to Cancer Wakefield project. This two year programme involves local GP practices, where many people are diagnosed with cancer but participation in the national cancer screening programmes is low. Screening can save lives and finding cancer early through screening makes it easier to treat and gives a better chance of full recovery. We are currently promoting bowel screening, but will be moving onto cervical screening and breast screening in the future.

### **Bowel cancer screening**

Bowel cancer is one of the most common cancers in the UK and most people diagnosed are over 60 years old. Screening aims to find bowel cancer at an early stage, before you notice any symptoms. The bowel cancer screening kit is a simple free test you can do at home. You will need to collect small samples of poo and then return the kit for testing. The test looks for tiny amounts of blood in poo, which can be a sign of cancer.
