<b>Description</b>	The purpose of routine appointments is for 'general health queries', diagnoses, and monitoring of conditions.  When you contact the surgery you will be offered the next available appointment. If it is regarding an ongoing issue we will do our best to book you in with the same GP.  You can see any GP of your choice, please make your preference known to the care navigators, who will do their best to meet your needs. Please be aware that requesting a specific GP, may increase your waiting time.	Urgent appointments are offered to deal with 'concerning' health issues that do not require immediate attention but are unable to wait for a routine appointment.	Same Day appointments are offered to be able to deal with 'significant' health issues that, whilst not an emergency (life threatening) do require immediate attention.  999 should be used for health emergencies including chest pain, struggling to breathe, stroke etc (see Red List). General Practice is not an emergency service.

	They are responsible for triaging home visit requests & arranging visits  Please call before 10:00am if possible if you think a home visit is required for the same day.  Please note most visits are done by the Belper home visiting team		
	Some same day 'significant' health issues can be dealt with by phone and these patients may be booked a Duty Doctor telephone appointment.  Examples – urgent treatment needed for a recurrent condition, skin changes where photos can be sent, pain killers needed for worsening of ongoing issue.
