

New RSV Vaccine - for older adults

Starting September 2024, those who turn 75 and those aged 75 to 80 (before the 80th birthday) will be eligible for a free vaccine at the practice to protect them from **respiratory syncytial virus** (RSV).

RSV is an infectious disease of the airways and lungs. It often causes symptoms similar to a cold, including • Cough • Sore throat • Sneezing • Runny or blocked nose



It can also make you become wheezy or short of breath and lead to pneumonia and other lifethreatening conditions. Every year, there are deaths due to this. RSV can be more severe in people with medical conditions such as heart or lung disease or a weakened immune system.

RSV infection is common in young children but is most serious for small babies and for older people. This is not INSTEAD of the flu or COVID vaccine, and should be given separately.

You can make an appointment at the Surgery for the RSV jab. This is available all year.

New Phone System

We have adopted the new <u>national</u> NHS phone system. We hope you will quickly notice improvements (despite a few teething problems). The new system has a number of enhanced features, including a ring back, which should improve your experience and access, and save waiting in queues.

Please make sure you listen to the call menu carefully—this has changed.

We appreciate being on hold is frustrating. We do take a lot of calls (and some calls can be long).

Flu Jabs - Support Your Practice

This year, you are entitled to a NHS flu jab as follows: When?

From early September (Group 1)

- Pregnant ladies
- 2-3 years old (as at 31st August)
- a child with clinical risks.
- After 2nd October (Group 2)

over 65

- aged over 18 with a clinical risk
- a carer
- a close contact of immunosuppressed individuals
- a frontline worker in a social care setting

Why?



<u>The NHS has made this specification</u> regarding the timings of when you should have the jab to ensure patients have the most effective cover for all of the season.

Having the jab too early does not provide the lasting protection to cover January-March. There has been an increase in flu incidents later in the season.

How?

Weekday flu clinics at EPCC start in September for Group 1. Flu (and COVID jabs) will be available to everyone after 2nd October.

EPCC's first Flu/COVID clinic will be **Saturday, 5th October** 9am—5pm. Weekday clinics will also run throughout the next 3-4 months. If you are eligible, you can have flu and COVID jabs together if you wish, or on separate dates.

Please support your practice book your flu jab with us

We have purchased flu jabs for all of our eligible

patients. We have to order over a year in advance to ensure we secure supplies. If unused, this will

be a waste. As a GP practice, we also depend on the income generated from flu jabs; it helps us to provide some healthcare services which make a loss—we would have difficulty in providing these without this income.

<u> Duick Tip £££</u>

If you pay for prescriptions (£9.90 each), you could save money by buying a NHS Prescriptions Prepayment Certificate (PPC).

3-month PPC - £32.05 (this will save money if you have more than 3 prescribed items in 3 months)

12-month PPC - £114.50 (will save if you have more than 11 prescribed items in 12 months)

HRT - annual PPC £19.80 (savings if you have more than 2 prescribed HRT items in 12 months)

Changing

The NHS has to evolve to meet new challenges. Demand is ever-increasing and against fund limitations. Change, although sometimes difficult, is not always a bad thing. We are lucky to have Allied Health professionals who have joined our team (First Contact Physiotherapist, Mental Health Specialists, Clinical Pharmacists). We have a number of other new Health Professionals join our team (as it's not always a GP a patient needs to see), but we still have our large team of 12 GPs.



Many of our GPs also offer specialist services. These are not available in all GP practices (eg minor ops, joint injections, coil and implant fitting). We see the value in offering these for our patients so they can have these services delivered locally and often avoid long waits at the hospital.
