Mark Towlson came to update us and talk about Dementia Friends.

Mark started by telling us that Gedling Borough Council has set itself a target of becoming dementia friendly throughout its services. He then asked us how we could explain - to a Martian – how to make a cup of tea. Not as daft as it sounds and we became aware of how much we take for granted, where a person with Dementia might miss one or two of the steps.

Dementia Friends aims to help people with Dementia to live fulfilling lives in the community. Mark said that when most people think about Dementia their immediate connection is negative. To get us the think differently, Mark asked us, in pairs, to complete a quiz. This consisted of a series of incomplete sentences on one side with the completed parts on the other, but in a different vertical order. It was very revealing to see that the sentences were a mixture of facts which helped point us to considering and challenging our assumptions about Dementia, even though we mostly were correct in our replies.

The Alzheimer Society has a good website for anyone who wants to find out more about dementia. There is a good area to answer people's questions. Exercise, good diet and socialising were key ingredients to help stave off the onset of dementia. However once the disease has taken root there is no cure it at the moment. There are some treatments that can halt or arrest the deterioration. Also early diagnosis is important in starting any sort of intervention. An early diagnosis can confirm symptoms and help with getting services involved to support both the carer and sufferer.

There are many different types of dementia and these can lead to impacts on motor skills, writing, perception, speech, short-term memory and sequencing amongst other symptoms. Mark suggested we look at the video on YouTube called "The Bookcase Analogy" to give us a way of understanding dementia https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=kkvyGrOElfA

Flu clinics: This year, following guidance from the Department of Health we have two types of adult flu vaccine. One which has proved to be more effective for those aged 65 and over, and one for the under 65s. We also need to ask for your understanding, as through no fault of ours, the delivery of our flus is not what we had hoped so you may have to wait before we can give you your vaccination. Unfortunately this is out of our control, but we should, by November, have enough vaccine for all who are eligible and want it.

We are sad to report that **Dr Rosalind Ki**ng has taken the decision to leave the practice, for personal reasons. She has been a partner for 21 years, and is highly regarded by patients and colleagues. We will miss her greatly. We have not yet appointed a new partner so her usual patients are now allocated between the five other partners.

Food bank: Irfan and the practice are collecting food items for the Salvation Army foodbank in Sneinton on an on-going basis. There will be a box to accept donated items and this will be delivered every Thursday.
