# Notes from the Roundwood Patients' Group Meeting held on Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> July 2024 6-8pm at Roundwood Surgery, Wood Street.

- 1. <u>Present:</u> Sylvia Porter and Jayne Birch-Jones (Joint Chair's), Dr Tadpatrikar (Dr T), Ros Reavill, (Practice Manager), Stu Hague (Local Medical Committee), 6 members with 7 apologies.
- 2. Notes from last meeting were **AGREED**.
- 2.1 Matters Arising

Car Parking – Ros reported that cameras will be installed in the practice car park imminently. Patients will need to record their numberplate on a screen in the Practice. There will be a 10-minute grace period to accommodate drop offs. Patients will be able to park in the car park at weekends but will need to pay. New signage will be in place.

- 3. **Practice Matters and Feedback**
- 3.1 **Primary Care Challenges**

Stuart Hague from Nottinghamshire Local Medical Committee (LMC) was in attendance to give an update. He explained that the LMC represents GP's, providing an advisory function and feeding into national negotiations on contracts and funding on their behalf. The British Medical Association (BMA) are the union for Drs, who have helped get hospital Dr's and junior Dr's their recent pay rises. Junior Dr's are to receive 22% and Hospital Consultants, 6%. GPs have been offered just 1.9% by the last government.

Hospitals are funded by NHS England. **GPs are independent contractors who get £107.57 per patient per year.** This **includes salaries for all general practice staff, their buildings, electricity etc.** For **every £ that the government spends on health, GP's only get 7-8 pence, despite them providing 90% of NHS appointments** overall. During the next couple of years, more GP's will retire, resign because of burn out and due to financial instability. Already **5 practices in Nottingham/Nottinghamshire have handed back their contracts to the government** and **more Practices will close without additional funding.** 

Dr T also mentioned the impact on retention of medical staff; Registrar's don't want to be Partners, most want to be salaried, and a large percentage want to go abroad.

Over the coming weeks patients will see some turbulence in Primary Care. GP's will be working to Contract (not striking), and not undertaking the significant additional non patient facing work which is usually delivered but that GP's are not paid. The bottom line is that the situation is bleak, and Patients should be aware that they will see a difference in their usual care.

## What can be done to protect GP's?

- The BMA has come up with safe working guidelines regarding a capacity limit on appointments.
- GP contracts need reviewing to make them financially viable, some contracts are 8 years old.
- The government needs to make it more attractive to become a GP.
- Patients need to be made aware and understand the situation and support their GP practice.

  ACTION: Stuart Hague to provide a crib sheet for the group, to ensure accurate and consistent information, so that PPG members can educate friends and family.

# **Staff News**

Laurie, one of the practice nurses has left. Patients are asked to be respectful to reception staff whilst the practice recruits, there will be limited practice nurse appointments. There are only currently 1.5 practice nurses.

On 7<sup>th</sup> August, there will be a change over of Registrars with 3 new registrars starting for 4 months. They will provide half hour appointments and will receive support from senior GP's.

#### **Appointments**

Last month the practice offered **5922 appointments**, there were **257 DNA's (4%) wasted appointments**.

Ros reported that the more advanced appointments offered, the more DNA rates increased. Text reminders do not work. Even patients with same day appointments DNA. The practice is actively

implementing its DNA policy, with some patients being removed from the list for consistently not turning up to appointments.

# Flu Clinic

3.4 This is on **October 3<sup>rd</sup> and appointments are now available.** The appointments will be at Roundwood Surgery, Wood Street. No help is required from PPG members.

#### 4. Rosewood Primary Care Network (PCN)

Dr T explained that PCN's are groups of GP practices that worked together (we have 5) and received funding from NHS England to fund extra roles. At a recent PCN time out day, these staff explained their roles, e.g a housebound nurse. Also Dr T did a presentation of "You asked, we delivered". This included improving care of the most vulnerable, eg homeless, severe mental health who now are case managed. A learning disability nurse since in post has improved health checks from 35% to 80%, with the hope of improving this to 100% over the next year.

Frailty was discussed as these patients account for the most hospital admissions. The PCN wants to provide holistic care for this group of patients and ideas were put forward which Dr T is putting into a plan for further discussion and action.

## 5. Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Integrated Care System (ICS)

Dr T explained that the ICS aims to deliver cohesive care across health and social care. The Integrated Care Board (ICB) directs and contracts the care and then the ICS delivers the care needed by the local population.

#### 6 Chairs Report/Wider Health Issues

Sylvia summarised activities:

- Jayne and I have taken the baton from Arthur Lacey after 8 years as Chair. Its a joint role so that we can chair, take minutes and share work between us.
- Visited the Community Champion at Tesco's, on Chesterfield Road who have a training room, that
  we could use if we wanted to hold some small group sessions, given that Roundwood does not have
  spare capacity during the day.
- Will be working with the Roundwood Practice Team on the best outcomes for our patients, in an ever-changing landscape to GP service delivery, staffing/resourcing, an Integrated Care System/ (ICS) Board (ICB) in Notts and a newly elected Government.
- Hope to work with community partners around health & wellbeing, with greater emphasis on preventative work, with commissioned services and the voluntary sector in Mansfield. Registering our group with the Mansfield CVS database.
- Future working with Rosewood PCN with the possibility of joint working re specific health events.
- As a PPG we would like to **support the Surgery to promote digital tools**, consider offering training to patients in accessing information relating to their health, e.g accessing appointment letters, results, make GP appointments & order mediation via the NHS app.
- 2 queries from patients through the PPG email address since the last meeting in relation to online access and booking an advance appointment, both were forwarded to Ros.

# SFHFT: -

- are employing a digital inclusion officer, to provide support and training to help patients use digital services as they become available, for example digital letters. They are very mindful that not all patients want to use digital services are undertaking equality assessments to ensure everyone has equal access to the same services wherever possible.
- are starting a project called eMeet and Greet which means when a patient is referred to the
  hospital, they will get a text message saying the hospital has received their referral and arranging
  their appointment is in progress. This is expected to start with hip and knee patients. This is being
  funded by NHS England.

are preparing to start providing a service called WayFinder. This will enable patients to access, cancel and rebook hospital appointments through the NHS app. Have a **new webpage** explaining all about their **different digital offerings for patients** www.sfhtr.nhs.uk/for-patients-visitors/nhs-app/ New cards to help patients register for the NHS App are available. We have a supply if anyone wants one. 7. <u>Treasurer's Report</u> – Anne Jenkins has expressed her **desire to stand down as Treasurer**. Given there have been no financial transactions in over 2 years, it was suggested that the bank account be closed and the money be returned to the Practice, with £50 being kept by the Chairs for petty cash and reported on at each meeting. Group members agreed to this.
