

What is ALBRAM?

- ALBRAM Patients' Group provides a communication pathway between patients and the Alconbury and Brampton Surgeries.
- Every patient registered at either surgery is a member of ALBRAM.
- The ALBRAM Committee consists of ten patient members elected annually at the AGM and two surgery representatives.



What does ALBRAM Do?

- ALBRAM gives patients an opportunity to provide feedback.
- ALBRAM provides an opportunity for patient involvement in the delivery of new services.
- ALBRAM volunteers run a patients' transport service.
- ALBRAM raises funds to purchase equipment and to provide additional services not funded by the NHS.
- ALBRAM hosts patient education evenings.



How does ALBRAM raise funds?

Donations, bequests, raffles, sale of used books, DVDs and craft items as well as donations from car scheme patients and volunteer drivers.

How have the funds been used?

High-backed chairs for the waiting rooms, an adjustable examination couch, 24-hour blood pressure monitors, ECG machine, audiometers and liquid nitrogen for wart treatment.
