We held a Car Scheme Social in August 2019 which was well attended with drivers from both Alconbury and Brampton. We had decided that it would be a nice gesture to give the drivers certificates for their length of service, as some of our drivers have been driving for 20 years plus. It was an excellent evening with lovely food, donated by the committee and drinks donated by the surgeries. It was nice for everyone to meet one another.

The committee continued to raise money but we only managed to have 1 raffle last year at Christmas, and sadly none this year. The prizes donated were once again outstanding including a hamper from the Lamacrafts, meal at the xxxx pub, Measures Butchers in Brampton, and the Hair salon in Alconbury. Thanks were given to the Lamacrafts, xxxx Pub, Measures and the Hair Salon. My thanks also goes to Harry once again for his hard work in sorting out the tickets and to those who collated, sorted and delivered the prizes.

We had stalls at the Brampton fete and Alconbury fete but it has been decided we will only do one of them in consecutive years, as getting the people to run the stalls proves quite difficult. Donations are still being donated, including monies from Mr Burton's family. With these monies, and the car scheme monies, we have been able to purchase quite a substantial amount of equipment for both surgeries. These include Cryotherapy for surgeries, audiometer, Air conditioning units for both surgeries, BP cuffs; stand-alone BP machine (sadly cannot be used at present due to COVID).

Earlier in the year Harry Cairns retired as our Treasurer after 5 years. It was sad to see him go and I would like to thank him for keeping our books up to date for this period of time. We now have a new Treasurer who is Di Barnet and I am sure Di will do an excellent job and I welcome her in her new role. Also we had Hammi xxxxx who was co-opted onto the committee so I would like to welcome Hammi too.

At our one and only committee meeting in October 2020 we were also able to purchase a nurses trolley, cryomachine, 10 x BP machines/cuffs and a phlebotomy chair which is excellent.

The surgeries have also been able to provide more phlebotomy sessions and admin cover at Brampton, electronic FP10's are now in place, extra admin in reception and secretarial support to help with patient's demands.

I am extremely grateful to all our volunteer drivers for the time they gave to the Car Scheme and I am sure Kim will update you in his report later. Many changes have happened within the car scheme over the past months and I know it has been a difficult time, but there are still some drivers who are willing to help deliver prescriptions to the residents. I wish to thank Kim, Sue and Di for their hard work in keeping the car scheme ticking over.

Sue is still keeping us in the technology age with ALBRAM on Facebook and in addition updating the website. My thanks to Sue.

If you are registered with either Alconbury or Brampton Surgery, you are a member of ALBRAM. The patients' group could not function without the input from all the Committee members, the Practice representatives, Dr Duncan Rea and Practice Manager Melanie Gearing. With so much going on during this year my thanks go to all the staff at Brampton and Alconbury who have worked so hard in this incredible year.
