What is the Mount Vernon Cancer Centre Review?

- The review is looking at all of the cancer services provided by Mount Vernon Cancer Centre and thinking about how they might need to change in the future.
- This includes outpatient chemotherapy, nuclear medicine, brachytherapy and haematology, provided by the Mount Vernon team, as well as radiotherapy and inpatient services.
- These services are provided at Mount Vernon, but oncologists from Mount Vernon also run outpatient clinics at many local hospitals in the areas patients come from.
- Patients generally come from Hertfordshire, Bedfordshire, North West London, North Central London, Berkshire and Buckinghamshire, as well as a few from further away.

<u>Background information on Primary Care Networks (PCNs)</u> – you may have heard this term in various patient or healthcare newsletters over recent months. Please check out the <u>East & North</u> Herts CCG website and you can find some more detail. Here are 2 extracts from the website.

Twelve 'Primary Care Networks' (PCNs) have been established across east and north Hertfordshire in a move designed to improve local or 'primary care' NHS services.

By encouraging GP practices to work more closely together in groups, together with other health and care staff in their local area, Primary Care Networks (PCNs) aim to provide more proactive, personalised, coordinated and joined-up health and social care.

Hanscombe House surgery is one of 4 surgeries sitting within "Hertford & Rurals" PCN (a total patient population of \sim 51,650), along with New River Health (resulting after the merger between Castlegate and Church Street), Wallace House and Watton clinic.

As of October 2020, we now have a patient representative on the Hertford & Rurals PCN and we hope to be able to share pertinent patient information through our PPG and hence via our meetings.

AWARENESS ITEM: "Cancel Out Cancer" session for patients – offering to Hanscombe Patients by trained volunteers. Veronica from our HH PPG and Michael Carn, chair of Upper Lea Valley Patient Locality Network (PLN) have offered to conduct such a session, at a timing suitable to the surgery. Sally is aware of this offer and will confirm next steps.

Hanscombe House Surgery report (Sally / Dr Oates)

Note: Silicon Practice Ltd is the name of the company who run our Hanscombe House website and the website product is called "Footfall".

Sally has kindly agreed to request the specific Footfall analysis in advance of our PPG meetings and here are a few pieces of data to share :-

- a) 851 contacts (ask GP/ask nurse)
- b) 126 e-consult queries
- c) Number of registered patients = 11,783, as of Oct 19th.

Workload at Hanscombe House – all staff have been extremely busy through Sept/October and these pressures are being felt right across all roles in the surgery. The PPG wanted to express their sincere thanks to the staff and were keen that all patients were fully aware, particularly as we move into this period of "winter pressures", alongside the COVID19 global pandemic.
