	BR gave a brief introduction to her patient and public engagement role with Ealing CCG. BR works with 76 GP practices in Ealing. At present there is no representative from the Argyle Surgery PPG on the CCG's Patient Engagement Reference Forum (PERF) and BR invited us to nominate a member. The Forum has members from the

a) Proposed move of Moorfields Eye Services

Moorfields Eye Hospital is proposing to build a new centre bringing together excellent eye care, ground-breaking research and world-leading education in ophthalmology. The proposal is called Oriel and further information is available here: www.oriel-london.org.uk/ - the proposed new centre is at the site of St Pancras Hospital. A public consultation is underway and concludes on 16 September 2019. BR suggested inviting representations from Moorfields to attend one of our meetings to discuss the proposed move.

b) NHS Winter Campaign and 'Choosing the Right Service'

BR briefed on the campaign to raise awareness about choosing the right services e.g. not going to A&E for minor ailments, how to us 111, pharmacy services, GP out of hours clinics for evenings and weeks. Engaging the wider membership of the PPG/Patients d) Review patient leaflet This item was deferred and FF/TB assured the PPG a final version of the leaflet would TB/FF be presented to the next meeting. e) Autumn 2019 Newsletter AC took the PPG through the various topics for articles for the next 2 to 3 newsletters and agreed who would be writing articles. AC is planning the Autumn edition and hopes to circulate in September and requested articles sooner rather than later. AC MB agreed to speak with Dr Abas about answering questions for the 'In the Know' MB section. MB also agreed to provide a photo of Catherine McCarthy. 40/2019 4. PPG Work Plan a) The Argyle Surgery Building **Update** BR was present for this item. AG provided a brief background to the proposed move for the surveyor. Dickens Yard is no longer a viable option and we are currently in discussions with two proposed residential developers: A2 Dominion (Hastings Road) and Southern Grove/Thames Valley Metropolitan (Manor Road). Discussions are progressing well with the Manor Road developers with the prospect of the surgery taking over the ground floor. AG reminded the PPG that this was discussed at the July 2019 AGM and it was unanimously agreed to progress discussions. FF added that we are in the pre-planning stage and the developer is consulting with the local community. Once agreement is reached regarding the space, we then start discussions about costs. This will need to be agreed before the planning application is submitted. The aim is September 2019 but FF is not sure this is viable. If all progresses well, the site would not be available until end of 2022/beginning of 2023. FF briefed on the interim solution and making the current premises habitable for the next 3 years. Builders have been engaged to provide estimates for any works needed and architects are proposing designs. There will be little change for patients as what is proposed will benefit staff with improved office space. Despite extensive research, no other alternative sites are viable. AG added that the developer is keen as it will be attractive to have primary care services on site. AG added that there are valid objections by the community. The development will provide affordable homes for key workers including NHS staff. FF added that like with Dickens Yard, the entire process needs to be repeated. We lost time with Dickens Yard because of the bureaucracy around the move and all the internal NHS processes to follow and it is hoped the new developer will not lose patience. With the proposed move, there will be an opportunity to improve the back-office functions, phlebotomy and pharmacy teams but also provide the opportunity for extra services to be offered such as screening. FF updated on the current phlebotomy service in place in Castlebar Parade/The Avenue – more rooms are being explored to run satellite clinics. 41/2019 5. Surgery News BR was present for this item. FF reminded the PPG that the Argyle Surgery is a teaching practice for doctors, nurses and pharmacists. 12 pharmacy registrars are currently in training to qualify as registered clinical pharmacists, believed to be the largest cohort in the country For GP registrars we provide practical training time and FF was pleased to advise that one of the current registrars, Dr Abas, is now employed by the surgery. ME updated on the nurse triage service and advised that more patients are aware of

the service and using it which has resulted in more appointments for true emergencies

	FF briefed on another initiative called Self C surgery. Patients would go online, ask questhis would be an alternative to face to face/t	stions and they would receive a response –	
	ME circulated DNA statistics for the Surgery. 160 patients do not attend appointments per month which equates to 45 hours of doctor and nurse time at a cost of £8000 per month. This issue will be included in our newsletter to help educate our patients.
