

Covid-19 vaccine summary for NEL

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15 Jan 2021

Update



- Covid vaccinations are being delivered at pace across NE London.
- The order in which we are vaccinating residents is determined by the JCVI (Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation).
- We have around 175,000 people in cohorts 1 and 2 in North East London
 - √ 4,500 care home residents and 14,000 residential care workers
 - ✓ 58,000 over 80s
 - √ 58,000 healthcare workers and 40,000 social care workers
- As at 8th Jan over 35,000 people have received the first vaccine, although this has already increased dramatically as more vaccine become available.
- We aim to have offered a vaccine:
 - ✓ By end January 2021: to all residents in care homes for older adults and staff (priority group 1) and all over 80s (priority group 2)
 - ✓ By mid February 2021: to all housebound patients in priority groups 1-4
 - ✓ Mid –end February 2021: to frontline health and social care staff (also in group 2), and priority groups 3 and 4
 - Group 3 all those 75 years of age and over
 - Group 4 all those 70 years of age and over and clinically extremely vulnerable individuals

Using different settings



- Primary care vaccination centres
 - Increasing to 17 sites in NEL, with more soon, organised by primary networks
 - At full capacity each will vaccinate c2,300 people a week

Roving vaccination teams

 Teams are visiting care homes, the housebound and other settings to vaccinate those who are unable to come to a vaccination centre

Large vaccination centres

- First one has opened at Excel in Newham vaccinating c500 people a day. Others will come online in late January, February and March
- By mid February we expect to be vaccinating c20,000 people a week (dependent on vaccine and staffing supply)


Community pharmacies

 We are working with NHS London and community pharmacies to deliver vaccines through pharmacies, focussing initially on areas where we have less geographical coverage from primary care and larger centres

Hospital vaccination hubs

- All of our NHS acute providers have established vaccination clinics
- Mainly vaccinating frontline NHS staff, social care and home care staff, other health and care staff who work for private providers, charities etc

North East London vaccination centres



Key messages



- We are using every vaccine that is provided to us. We are ensuring as more vaccine becomes available we will continue to use every single dose.
- We are currently contacting over 80s, care homes and frontline health and social care staff who are the only eligible people.
 - If you get more than one invitation, choose the most convenient
 - We will be opening up more sites
 - Once we have offered the vaccine to over 80s, care homes and frontline staff we will be vaccinate priority groups 3/4. Groups 1-4 account for 88% of Covid deaths
 - · We will come to you if you are housebound
- The vaccine will not protect you if you haven't had it.
- The MHRA, the official regulator has said the vaccines have good safety profiles and offer a high level of protection.
- There are no foetal/meat/animal derivatives, or porcine products
- Second doses have been postponed because even with just one dose the Pfizer/BioNTech vaccine and the Oxford/AstraZeneca vaccine have been estimated to offer 74-89% effectiveness from two weeks after it is given.
 - Every time we vaccinate someone a 2nd time, we are not vaccinating someone else for the first time. If a family has two elderly grandparents and there are two vaccines available, it is better to give both 80% than to give one 95 % protection with two quick doses, and the other grandparent no protection at all.

- 1. Please help the NHS by not contacting us for a vaccine. We are prioritising vaccinating people who experts have agreed will benefit the most. We will let people know when it is their turn.
