HOW DO WE USE YOUR INFORMATION?

Your data is collected for the purpose of providing direct patient care. However, we can discuss this information, if required, by law. If you use consent, or if it is justified in the public interest.

The practice may be requested to support research, however, we will always gain your consent before sharing your information with medical research databases, unless we have to do so by law.

MAINTAING CONFIDENTIALTY

We are committed to maintaining confidentiality and protecting the information we hold about you. We adhere to the GDPR and the MHS code of confidentiality and security, as well as the guidance issued by the Information Commissioners Office (ISO)

RISKS STRATIFACTION

Risk Stratification is a mechanism used to identify and subsequently manage those patient deemed as being high risk or requiring urgent or medical care. Usually this includes patients with long-term conditions, such as cancer for example.

Your information is collected from a number of sources and the information is processed electronically and given a risk score which is relayed to your GP who then decides on any actions to ensure that you receive the most appropriate care.

INVOICE VALIDATION

Your information maybe shared if you have received treatment, to determine which Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) is responsible for paying for your treatment.

This information may include your name, address and treatment data.

All this information is held securely and is confidential, it will not be used for any other purpose or shared with third parties.
