

We are now heading into the Winter period and wanted to share with you all of the projects we have put in place to ensure that we are able to provide the best possible care to our patients over this very busy period.

On-line Consultations – eConsults

Using an eConsult is always the quickest and safest way to contact the practice for a medical or administrative concern. Your eConsult will be triaged by a GP and you will be contacted the same day with the outcome, this may be to book an appointment, request a sample or test, or to send out a Fit note etc.

To ensure as many patients as possible have access to eConsult, we have extended the opening times for eConsults, and as long as there is clinical capacity we open from, 7am on a Monday. We appreciate it can be tricky to contact at 8am, and hope that the earlier start will enable more patients to log in and complete an eConsult.

In September we provided 2,003 eConsults, which is 555 more than August where we provided 1,448. When you complete an eConsult it is sent to the Practice and will triaged by one of our own Practice GPs. You will receive a response from us the same day by call or text.



If you feel unwell over the weekend, please do not wait until Monday morning. There are alternative services open, whilst your surgery is closed:

- Community Pharmacists
- NHS111
- Urgent Treatment Centre at Lewes & Crawley who can treat:
 - o sprains, strains and suspected broken limbs
 - o minor head injuries
 - o cuts, grazes, bites and stings
 - minor scalds and burns
 - ear and throat infections
 - skin infections and rashes
 - o coughs and colds
 - o vomiting and diarrhoea

• Minor Injury Units at Uckfield & East Grinstead who can treat:

- Acute limb injuries including fractures, wounds, sprains and strains
- Bites and stings
- Cuts and grazes and wounds
- Ear and throat infections
- Foreign bodies in the eyes, ears, nose
- Sore throats
- Acute lower back pain
- Minor allergic reactions
- Minor burns and scalds

- Minor head injuries with no loss of consciousness (anyone aged over 65 years may be referred to A&E for further assessment and management)
- Minor nose bleeds
- Simple eye infections such as conjunctivitis or scratches to the eye
- Simple urinary tract infections (UTI) (females aged 17 or over, who have not had a UTI in the last three months).
- Minor skin infections
- Suspected arm and lower leg broken bones (children under the age of four should be taken to A&E – RSCH Brighton).
