If you are concerned about any aspect of your sexual health then you can make an appointment in confidence at your local NHS sexual health service. Most services also have a drop-in service and give telephone advice.

Emergency contraception

You can use emergency contraception - often known as the morning after pill - if:

- You have had sex without using any contraception
- You think the contraception might not have worked.

Some community pharmacists offer free emergency contraception - ring NHS Direct on 0845 46 47 to find your nearest participating pharmacy.

All advice and treatment given is confidential (including for under 16s) and will not be communicated to your GP. Please contact the service where you live for more help.

Free condoms

<u>C card</u> is a scheme for young people aged 13-25 year olds. You can get free condoms at any C card outlet. C card is available across the North East. Call **0800 28 29 30** 7am to midnight seven days a week or visit the <u>RU THINKING</u> website.

Access to abortion services

Women living in Northumberland, Newcastle or North Tyneside who are eligible for NHS treatment can self refer to abortion services this means they no longer have to go through their GP or sexual health service to get a referral although referrals can still be made through these services too.

Services are free and confidential and are available to women of all ages on a range of days and times. When contacting the services you will need to tell them your name, date of birth and the first day of your last menstrual period. All services also provide support with pregnancy decision making counselling if required and contraceptive advice and treatment.
