The Porch Surgery Newsletter is back after an absence caused by the Covid Pandemic that affected so many parts of our daily lives.

#### Surgery and staffing updates

We have had a number of staff changes since our last newsletter:

- Alongside this, there has been a number of changes to our admin and reception teams.

#### **Extended Access hours**

The Porch Surgery is now open until 8pm on a Monday evening and from 7:30am on Tuesday morning а (excluding bank holidays). We also now offer appointments on a Friday evening and on a Saturday every five weeks on a rotational basis with the other 4 surgeries in our Primary Care Network (PCN). These appointments are face to face or telephone on a Saturday morning and telephone on a Friday evening and Saturday afternoon. #### **GP Appointments**

A variety of telephone and face to face GP appointments are released every day for the same day, the following week and for two weeks' time. Please be kind to the reception staff as you may have to call on more than one occasion to secure an appointment, please be assured that if your matter is deemed urgent you will be booked for a telephone consultation with the duty doctor. The surgery also provides a variety of appointments alongside GP appointments, these include Minor Illness Clinic (MIC), Advanced Nurse practitioner, Physician Associate, Phlebotomy, Housebound home visit appointments and other clinics.

## Missed appointments

We are continually working hard to reduce the appointments wasted each year. As a patient it is your responsibility to cancel an appointment in good time so it can be released for others to use. You can cancel your appointment via the NHS app or telephoning the surgery and selecting option 1.

In February there were 6950 appointments – of which 85 were DNA's. Of these 85, 39 were missed nurse appointments, 25 were phlebotomy, 10 were GP appointments, 7 were physician associate, 3 were immunisations and 1 was a minor illness clinic appointment. This equates to over 31 hours worth of appointments.

Patients that regularly miss appointments with no warning will be removed from The Porch register.

#### PA telephone line

We have another option for patients when calling the surgery. Between 9:00am-4:30pm, patients can directly to the medical secretaries. This is especially useful for patients to get hold of the team without needing to join the queue for the enquires However, this will not be used as a back route to get an appointment, if this happens patients will be asked to call back and press the correct option for appointments.
