
Doorstep Scams


- Never open the door to someone you don't know
- Always check someone's ID badge, tell them to wait outside and verify their identity by phoning the company that they say they are from
- Put Trading Standards No Cold Calling sticker on your door as a reminder

Text scams

- Forward scam texts to 7726 (spells SPAM on number keypad)
- Never click on a hyperlink
- Don't assume that the text is genuine

Online Scams

- Forward suspicious emails to report@phishing.gov.uk
- Always check the sender's email address
- Check grammar and spelling mistakes

Home Security

Top Tips

- Lock all your doors, windows, side & back gates
- Avoid leaving valuables on display and in plain view
- Keep keys out of sight & out of reach from doors & windows.
- Mark your property. Register for free at Immobilise.
- Join your local <u>Neighbourhood Watch Scheme</u>

Garden Security

- Ensure garden tools and equipment are locked away
- Prickly shrubs are effective at deterring trespassers
- Crunchy gravel & PRI lighting can alert you & deter intruders

Going Away

- Avoid discussing holiday plans on social media.
- Ask someone to watch over your house
- Cancel any deliveries.

Community Safety - Home Alone

Here's a bright idea - leave a light on!

- No car in driveway?
- No visible home security?
- No lights?
- No one home?

- shut and lock all doors/windows
- Keep valuables out of sight
- Use a timer light switch
- Mark valuables



Purse Dipping

Prevention Tips

Do not leave your handbag hanging over the shopping trolley or unattended at any time. Keep your bag on you at all times. Ensure your bag is closed with a secure zip fastening pocket to keep your purse protected.



Do not accept help from seemingly well-meaning strangers and never allow yourself to be distracted, especially whilst loading your bags in the car.



When using an ATM or chip and pin device always shield your number with your hand.



Fraudsters sometimes fit devices to cash machines that trap your card. If your card is retained by the machine for any reason, report it to your card company immediately.



Make sure you have your card company's 24 hour contact number stored in your mobile phone. This number can be found on the back of your card.



Call your bank ASAP to stop your card if it is stolen or you notice unusual transactions on your account.



The Safe Place Scheme

What is a Safe Place?

A business that has signed up to the scheme will provide a temporary safe haven to a vulnerable person who might find themselves in a difficult situation when they are out and about.



The Safe Place Scheme can help you if you feel lost, scared or confused when you're out in your local community.

How do you identify a Safe Place?

Businesses who are part of the scheme will display the safe place sticker in their window. This means that a vulnerable person can go in & ask for help.

How to find a Safe Place?

Most towns and villages across Buckinghamshire have a safe place.
