# Practice Have you booked your Whooping Cough Vaccination?



The NHS is encouraging anyone pregnant to come forward and book their Whooping Cough Vaccination.

Whooping cough (Pertussis) is a bacterial infection of the lungs and breathing tubes. It spreads very easily and can sometimes cause serious problems. It's important for babies and children to get vaccinated against it.

The pertussis vaccination in pregnancy provides protection for pregnant women and young babies against serious illness. If you're pregnant you should also have the whooping cough vaccine – ideally between 16 and 32 weeks.

# Liver Pilot Study

A group of Torbay GP practices, including Brunel have been selected for a national programme that aims to diagnose liver cancer at an early stage. So, if you fall into one of the high-risk categories, you could be eligible for a liver health check.

To be eligible for the programme, you must: Be aged 16 or over and registered with their:

- Brunel Medical Practice
- Chelston Hall Surgery
- Croft Hall Medical Practice or
- Southover Medical Practice

**AND** fall within one of the high-risk groups:

- Been diagnosed with alcohol related liver disease or non-alcohol fatty liver disease
- Been diagnosed with Hepatitis C or Hepatitis
- Have type 2 diabetes and a BMI of over 30 (or over 27 if you are from an ethnic background)
- Drink more than 30 units of alcohol per week


We will update our patients with more information and a date for when this goes live in due course. We are hoping that this new change will reduce the current waiting times to get through to the surgery.
