# Have you received your RSV vaccination invite?

Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) is an infectious disease of the airways and lungs. RSV infection often causes symptoms similar to a cold, including cough, sore throat, sneezing and runny or blocked nose. It can also make you become wheezy or short of breath and lead to pneumonia and other lifethreatening conditions. There is no specific treatment, and most infections will get better by themselves. However every year thousands of older adults need hospital care for RSV, and some of them will die. RSV can be more severe in people with medical conditions such as heart or lung disease or a weakened immune system.

The best way to protect yourself is to have the vaccine. This is being offered to patients aged 75-80 years for the first time this year. A single dose of vaccine will help to boost protection as you reach an age group at highest risk of serious RSV infection.

We are running a dedicated RSV vaccination clinic on Saturday 14th September 2024, and then will offer appointments for the RSV vaccination every month in the normal nurse appointments. For those patients who are eligible you should have now received an invite via text message or letter. If you have an appointment with a member of the nursing team already booked for another matter, you will be offered the RSV vaccine at that appointment so you don't need to book an appointment.

# Flu Vaccinations 2024/25








## Over 40? Have you had your blood pressure checked?



An estimated 4.2 million adults in England are living with undiagnosed high blood pressure. Left untreated, it can significantly increase your risk of a fatal heart attack, stroke, kidney disease or vascular dementia.

High blood pressure usually has no symptoms. The only way to know if you have high blood pressure is to get a blood pressure test.
