Information about contraceptive implant

This is a progesterone containing rod that is inserted under your arm that provides 3 years of contraceptive cover.

- If still interested please book a telephone appointment with one of the family planning doctors or advanced nurse practitioners
 - During this call we will check there are no contraindications and discuss risk of pregnancy and when it is best to fit your implant
- It is important you are not pregnant at the time of fitting:
 - If you are currently using a hormonal method (pill, patch, vaginal ring, injection and non-expired implant) then your device can be fitted at any convenient time and you can continue to use your current method correctly until your fitting.
 - If you are currently using condoms, diaphragm, natural methods including withdrawal, or have an expired implant or expired IUD/IUS device then you have two options:
 - 1 abstain from sex from day one of your period until your fitting (or abstain from sex for three weeks if your periods are irregular)
 - 2 arrange to use a short-acting form of contraception, for example, pill, patch, for at least 4 weeks before the fitting
- You will then need to complete a self-assessment checklist that will help you decide if you are ready to have an implant fitted
 - This will be sent by text or by post if you don't have a smart phone.
 - We will then get you booked in.
 - Please cancel the appointment well in advance if you cannot attend or you or a house member has had symptoms of COVID in the past 14 days.

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
