#### **COVID Vaccination Programme**

If you have received a letter from the NHS stating you **may** need a 3rd dose vaccination because you have been identified as clinically at risk please contact reception who will take your details. If you are eligible you will be invited to a clinic at Kington.

If your letter states you are invited for a booster this is one further dose and you will need to go through 119 or the National Booking site to book your vaccination. We do not have access to these appointments and unfortunately cannot book them on your behalf. Alternatively visit hereford-shire.gov.uk/grabajab for the more local walk-in clinics.

### Flu Vaccination Programme

We are still experiencing problems with deliveries. The uptake of the vaccination has been higher than in previous years across the country so many areas are experiencing shortages.

If you have received notification from the surgery inviting you to book an appointment, please book as soon as possible. Please be aware that deliveries for the under 65's may not reach us until the end of December. We are doing our best to prioritise those who are clinically at risk.
