	C.	Staff illness , unfortunately we have just come through a challenging time with illness, with multiple people off at once we just cannot find locums. If we have to cancel, your appointment is the last resort. We have tried to find cover and reallocate where possible.	
	d.	Parking This is becoming a major issue, We have numerous staff members cars hit over recent months causing damage due to carelessness or bad parking. We are asking that patients only park in marked space. If there is not a white or yellow line, it is not a parking space and you are obstructing free flow. In Kingsland, there is the Coronation Hall car park that can be used. In Orleton there is the village hall car park. We ask that you do not block the main roads outside the surgeries and consider the neighbours when you park outside their property, try not to park over driveways.	

I have witnessed people leaning or sitting on the Doctors cars in Kingsland when waiting for their prescription, this again causes damage and we request that you reframe from doing it.

3. COVID and Flu 2024/25 Programme – We ran our first clinics simultaneously at Leintwardine and Orleton on the 5th Oct. It worked really well.

We have Kingsland this Saturday 12 Oct. Appointments are fully booked. Further planned Covid/Flu clinics 31st October, 4th and 6th November all at Kingsland booked appointments only.

Health Care Assistants and Physician Associate can now administer the Flu vaccine but not Covid.

There have been a few grumbles about parking, this is something we have no control over and have taken steps to improve over the years. This was one of the considerations when moving to appointment only clinics. We can manage the volume of people and avoid those lengthy ques around the car park and blocking the main roads.

6. Questions from Patients

a. Why is it not possible to currently see test result documents online in patient's accounts? Is this just test result docs or all docs and is this situation permanent?

For test results does the practice ask patients to use (your busy) phone lines?

Answer: All results as soon as they are filed should be visible to the patient.

b. Patients have been voicing opinions and feeling unsettled, with new faces of GP's now at the practice. Their questions have been: Who is who? What do they look like? What do they specialise in? Which GP is mainly at which practice? Who would you recommend? photos either up in surgeries or rolling on the screens.

Answer: we have looked at adding photos to the website; there has always been a resistance to this. It is something we can look at again. We do appreciate there is a lot of change at the moment but it will benefit the patients as we have increased our GP team to 8, we have GP Registrar with us until August 2025.

With regards to specialities they are all generalists however; Dr Derbyshire and Dr Oloro have an interest in woman's health.

c. Patients would have liked to have included within the text the dates and surgeries these clinics were taking place so as to have been more prepared.

Answer: Unfortunately we can only get so many characters onto a text then it becomes 2 and doubles the cost. We spend time trying to be succinct to get the relevant information to the patient. We did advertise that they would be in October however we did not know when the COVID vaccine was going to arrive at one point we did not have any for the 5^{th.} We had to go ahead and get the letters and texts out regardless or we would have been too late.

d. Is there a possibility that the surgeries can be used by the blood donor service either as a one off or to have regular donor sessions to help remedy the national blood shortage situation?

Answer: Unfortunately we would have to enhance our insurance as it is work outside normal General Medical Service contract. This would come at quite a cost.

- a. Neighbourhood and community support Gilly Lloyd shared information about a proposed scheme called Neighbourhood and Community support. Coco is the Compassionate Co-Ordinator for this project which would provide a Listening Ear for the vulnerable/depressed, people who are isolated to name a few. Yarpole is interested in starting a group. Bodenham has one already. Gilly to keep the group updated and Fiona to try and find out more.
