1: How to help make yourself better

Take paracetamol to reduce a fever; always follow the instructions Ask your pharmacist for advice on reducing your symptoms

Get plenty of rest until you feel better Drink enough fluids to avoid feeling thirsty

Wash your hands to help stop infections spreading Use tissues when you sneeze to help stop infections spreading

2: Check how long your symptoms last

An earache: most get better by

8 Days

A sore throat: most get better by

7 - 8 Days

A cold: most get better by

14 Days

A cough: most get better by

21 Days

The Surgery Car park and One-way system

The roads around the surgery were changed into a one-way system a few months ago. Some people may not be aware of this and so there have been instances of people going the wrong way to and from the surgery car-park. You cannot now turn into Kent Avenue from Alton Street or Walford Road.

The most important point is that **you must turn right when you leave the surgery** Car park and head towards Walford Road. There are occasions when people turn left when they leave the surgery and go into oncoming traffic.
