## Introducing: the Herefordshire Shared Care record.

We wanted to let you know that Herefordshire are connecting our systems to offer joined-up health and care records. The aim is to enable better, safer care and treatment for us all. Previously, these systems were not connected, meaning that you often had to repeat your story each time you received care at a different organisation, or with a different health professional.

The Shared Care Record means up-to-date records will be immediately available to professionals caring for you as a patient, when you need direct care. It will mean a doctor in a hospital, or a paramedic who attends a 999 call will be able to confidentially access the same crucial information that we can at the Practice, such as details of any allergies and current medications, bringing potentially life-saving benefits. It is intended to support good decision making but does not replace local records nor does it display all information held by individual provider. Robust security measures are in place to protect your health information and all staff must follow the law on keeping your information confidential.

The Shared Care Record is a LOCAL scheme, and not the same as the General Practice Data for Planning and Research Directions (GPDPR), which is a national NHS Digital initiative to use GP practice data for research and planning purposes.
