COVID news

Unlike the rest of the population, NHS staff are still required to do regular lateral flow tests and are unable to work if they are COVID positive- for up to 10 days. This month we have had admin, medical and nursing staff all testing positive and having to keep away-all adding to extra pressure.

Still on the topic of COVID, we also really appreciate how good most surgery-users are at wearing face masks in the building even though this is no longer common practice elsewhere. Many of you have also done lateral flow tests before coming into the surgery with fever symptoms. As you all know, finally the official list of recognised symptoms has been expanded to a much broader range (https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/symptoms/main-symptoms/).

We also appreciate it when you let our reception staff know if you may have any covid symptoms when booking an appointment, as it all helps to protect our most vulnerable patients and staff.

Also regarding vaccinations, if you are over 65 you are eligible for a one off 'pneumonia jab' to protect against infection with streptococcal pneumonia.
