Dr Cottrell joined the Practice last year and has written the following article for the Newsletter:

I have just completed my first year as a Partner at Wolstanton Medical Centre and I am delighted to be back at the practice. I am an 'Academic' GP, which means that in addition to working at the practice three days a week, I spend the rest of the working week at Keele University's Primary Care and Health Sciences Centre undertaking research and implementation (putting research into 'real world practice'). My PhD focussed on the management of osteoarthritis by GPs and one of my ongoing research interests is improving osteoarthritis management in primary care. Much of my work away from the face-to-face clinical work that you all see, and the paperwork that comes with that, has been focussed on improving the quality of primary care, through evaluating new services or innovations or auditing care provided (checking what should be happening is happening). This is central to the long-standing ethos of Wolstanton Medical Centre, which, for decades has been a front-runner in innovation, education, research and high-quality care. One of the highlights for me in this first year has been our successful application to Keele University to become the first ever Keele University Academic General Practice.
