

Have you considered participating in a clinical study to learn more about your cardiovascular disease and living healthily?

If you have experienced a heart attack, a stroke or you suffer from insufficient blood flow in your legs, this study may be for you

Did you know that even with the best medicines and standard of care, many people with cardiovascular disease remain at risk of suffering from a heart attack or a stroke due to build-up of fat in their blood vessels? This condition is called 'atherosclerosis', and it is partly driven by a bodily process known as 'inflammation'. At the moment, no treatment exists to manage this inflammation. You may want to consider participating in the **ZEUS** study, evaluating a new drug for its ability to treat inflammation and reduce the risk of stroke, heart attack, and death, from cardiovascular causes. Join **ZEUS** in a journey of up to 4 years, with expert care, where your health is at the centre.

What is the ZEUS study?

In the **ZEUS** study, we will investigate if the study medicine called 'ziltivekimab' can reduce the risk of stroke, heart attack, and death, from cardiovascular causes in people with inflammation in their blood vessels.

Can I participate in the ZEUS study?

You may qualify to participate in the **ZEUS** study if you meet all of the below criteria:

- You are 18 years of age or older
- You have had a stroke or heart attack, have insufficient blood flow in your legs
- Have kidney disease which does not require dialysis or a transplant
- You are able to attend regular clinic visits and receive phone calls over a period of up to 4 years

Why should I participate?

- **Join** a unique worldwide community helping to investigate the possible benefits of ziltivekimab in people like yourself
- **Learn** more about your cardiovascular or kidney disease, and how to live more healthily
- **Receive** close care and follow-up to best manage your health
 - where COVID-19 safety and flexibility are high priorities
