#### Pre-School Booster and Measles, Mumps and Rubella Vaccination

Measles is a very infectious viral illness that is spread by coughs and sneezes. If you are not protected and have even passing contact with someone who has measles, the chances are that you will be infected too.

If you catch measles you will probably feel very poorly and be off school or work for around 10 days.

There is no treatment or cure for measles. Symptoms of measles include fever, sore red eyes, and rash.

It can be a very serious infection for some people. Complications are more likely to occur in certain groups including people with weakened immune systems, babies under one year old and pregnant women. Complications can include chest and ear infections, fts, diarrhoea, encephalitis (infection of the brain) and brain damage. Those who develop complications may need to be admitted to hospital for treatment.

#### **Against Domestic Abuse**

You may have noticed our Waiting Room displays each month. The topics are chosen by the Patient Participation Panel and usually have a health or social link.

This month is the United Nations International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women (25<sup>th</sup> November)





We decided to look at this slightly differently and to promote awareness and support for women and men who may be subjected to domestic abuse.

Domestic abuse is not always physical violence. It can also include:

- coercive control and 'gaslighting'
- economic abuse
- online abuse
- threats and intimidation
- emotional abuse
- sexual abuse

Anyone can be a victim of domestic abuse, regardless of gender, age, ethnicity, religion, socio-economic status, sexuality or background.

#### Get help and support

All forms of domestic abuse are not acceptable in any situation. If you're experiencing domestic abuse and feel frightened of, or controlled by, a partner, an ex-partner or family member, it's important to remember that it's not your fault and there is no shame in seeking help.
