Our patient participation group meets every 2-3 months to discuss matters concerning the practice and surrounding areas. We value patient input as this can only help us improve the service we provide. We also run our virtual PPG through facebook alongside the actual meetings, making these meetings accessible to those who can't attend. If you want to take part, you can find the facebook group by searching for 'Adelaide Street Patient Participation Group' and requesting to join, or turn up at our next meeting at Whitegate Drive Health Centre.

The NHS has put out new and exciting guidance that we will be starting some new ways of working late in the year. All GP surgeries, while remaining independent, will also work with nearby surgeries for some projects. These groups of surgeries will be known as Primary Care Networks and our specific group will be called The Central West Primary Care Network.

The surgeries represented will be Adelaide Street Practice (including the Harris Medical Centre), St Paul's Medical Centre, Elizabeth Street Practice and South King Street Medical Centre. This will then cover a population of around 35000 patients. There has to be a Clinical Director - which is an elected post - for the network. We have decided to have a shared post. This will be a shared role for Dr Cruz Augustine

(Adelaide Street) and Dr Leanne Rudnick (St Paul's). There is also an elected Primary Care Network manager, Luan Stewart (Adelaide Street) has been chosen for that role. As the set up progresses and we get more information it will be shared with you. In the meantime we will be setting up a page on the website to keep our patients updated.

The first joint project was population health management - a pilot project to see if we can change the health of patients by improving their social issues. We have started to look at a specific group of patients who live in houses of multiple occupancy. If this pilot session works, it will be rolled out across the Central West Network. Have a look at the video on the website - under population health.

Childhood Vaccinations

Each surgery runs clinics to vaccinate your children. These are held once a week, on a Wednesday morning at Harris and on a Thursday afternoon at Adelaide. Your child will be invited a total of 5 times. At 8weeks, 12 weeks, 16 weeks, 1yr old and for preschool vaccinations when

3yrs 4 months old. If you have not received an invitation to these clinics and you feel your child is due to attend, or would like to check your child's immunisation status, then please contact either surgery. Further information: www.nhs.uk/Conditions/ vaccinations

treat them accordingly. It is a completely anonymous and confidential service, where patients do not even need to give us their names if they do not wish.

DNA (Did Not Attend) Register

If you have visited the practice recently or our website, you may have noticed the number of appointments that are unattended each month. For example, in January this year 343 appointments were wasted because of nonattendance.

From June onwards we are piloting a new way of trying to deal with this called the DNA register. Patients who did not attend an appointment on at least 3 occasions in the last 3 months will be placed on the register. All patients will be

be notified by letter if this is the case.

If you are on the DNA register you can book appointments in the usual way but must either CANCEL or CONFIRM in advance that you will be attending. If you do not confirm, the appointment will be cancelled and made available for another patient to use. If you then come in for your appointment, you will not be seen, and will have to re-book. The letter you receive will inform you of when you need

to contact the practice to confirm your appointment.

If you do intend to cancel, this can be done in several ways. You can either;

- Call us
- Reply CANCEL to your text reminder
- Use online services (myGP, Patient Access)

A Healthy Recipe To Try...

Chicken Chow Mein Serves 3 Ingredients

Dash sunflower oil

- 1 onion, halved and thinly sliced 2 chicken breasts, shredded into 4cm long strips
- 1 carrot, cut into 2cm long matchsticks
- 125g shiitake mushrooms 1 courgette, cut into sticks 100g frozen soya beans, defrost-
- 2 tsp Chinese 5 spice 2 tsp reduced salt soy sauce 2 cloves garlic, crushed 300g pack ready-cooked noodles

Method

- **1.** Add the sunflower oil to a large pan or wok, then add the onion and cook for 2 minutes.
- 2. Next, add the chicken and stir constantly for 3-4 minutes, making sure the pieces don't stick together.

- **3.** Add the carrots, mushrooms and courgette. Cook for a further 3-4 minutes, again, stirring constantly.
- **4.** Next, add the soya beans, Chinese 5 spice, soy sauce, garlic and noodles.
- **5.** Mix well for another 3-4 minutes until the noodles are hot through.
