MRS BEETON'S COOKERY

Wash 1 1/2 oz of pearl barley until the water is clear, drain put it and 3 pints of stock into a stewpan , boil up and simmer gently for about 1 1/2 hours stirring occasionally. Rub through a hair or fine wire sieve, return to the stewpan , add a pint of milk and seasoning and bring to the boil. Knead 1 oz of cornflour and 1 1/2 oz of butter or good cooking fat together, put the mixture into the soup and stir until it becomes smoothly united with it . Add nutmeg if liked, place some croutons of fried bread in the tureen, pour in the soup and serve hot.

Manchester homelessness charity appeals for new trustees

Becoming a trustee and working alongside others provides you with personal and professional development, as well as the satisfaction of supporting a cause you care about.
