IMPORTANT UPDATES

Seasonal Vaccinations: As the colder weather starts to arrive so will Flu, COVID, Pneumonia and RSV. Please see more information about these vaccines in this newsletter.

Cervical Screening: The nurses are now able to do cytology and do your smear tests at the Practice. If you are over-due your routine smear check, please contact Reception on 0161 493 9101 to book an appointment.

SEASONAL VACCINATIONS

It is important to get your seasonal flu and COVID-19 vaccinations if you're at higher risk of getting seriously ill from these illnesses.

Who can have the Flu & COVID Vaccines.

You may be able to get the NHS Flu and COVID Vaccines if you:

- are aged 65 or over (excluding those who be 65 by 31.03.24)
- have certain health conditions or a Learning Disability
- are pregnant
- live with someone who has a weakened immune system
- are a carer
- are a frontline health or social worker
- live in a care home

How to get your Flu or COVID Vaccine

If you are eligible you can get an NHS Flu Vaccine from:

- Benchill Medical Practice
- A Pharmacy that is offering NHS Flu Vaccinations (if youre aged 18 & over).
- Some maternity services (if you're pregnant)



If you are eligible you can get an NHS COVID Vaccine from:

- Call 119 to Book or
- Book via the COVID Vaccine booking website
- Go to a walk in COVID Vaccination site.

PNEUMOCCOCAL VACCINE

If you are Over 65, you are also eligible for the pneumococcal vaccine, which will help protect you from pneumonia. Ask at Reception about making an appointment.

NEW RSV VACCINATION....

The RSV vaccine helps protect against <u>respiratory</u> <u>syncytial virus (RSV)</u>. RSV is a common cause of coughs and colds. It usually gets better by itself, but in some people (especially babies and older adults) it can cause illnesses such as:

- pneumonia (a lung infection)
- <u>bronchiolitis</u> (a chest infection that affects babies)

Who should have the RSV vaccine

The RSV vaccine is recommended if:

- you're pregnant from 28 weeks onwards to help protect your baby after they're born
- you're aged 75 to 79

Please contact Reception to book your RSV Vaccination today, and lets stay protected

CHILDRENS FLU VACCINES

Benchill Medical Practice are offering the children's vaccine to children aged between 2 to 3 year and children who are at risk. Please contact Reception to make an appointment.

School-aged children (Reception to Year 6) will be offered the vaccine by the School Immunisation Service. and children with certain health conditions.

CAMHS MEDICATION UPDATE

There is currently a supply issue with medication on a Shared Care Agreement. issued by Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS).

Please note that we will only be able to issue a supply of alternative medication once CAMHS have advised what the best alternative should be.
