

# Notifying Agencies/Organisations When Someone Has Died



When someone has died, you may need to (or wish to) notify several different organisations about the death. The chart below contains suggested agencies or organisations to contact\*. You can print the chart and add your own notes.

<p><b>‘TELL US ONCE’</b> There is a free ‘Tell Us Once’ service through which you can report a death in Scotland, England and Wales (<a href="https://www.gov.uk/after-a-death/organisations-you-need-to-contact-and-tell-us-once">https://www.gov.uk/after-a-death/organisations-you-need-to-contact-and-tell-us-once</a>). The service enables most government departments to be automatically informed of the person’s death. These include the following:</p>				
Driver and Vehicle Licensing Agency (DVLA): for cancellation of driving licence				
HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC): for personal tax affairs				
Passport Office: for cancellation of passport				
Department for Work and Pensions (DWP): for cancellation of benefits and entitlements e.g. Universal Credit, State Pension				
Any local authority (council) services, e.g. Blue Badge Scheme; Electoral Register
