1 Welcome and Introductions

Agreed next meeting may be in winter, so it would be best to have an earlier timed meeting such as midday.

Gave an overview of the PCN for all newcomers. Reminded about the 'terms of reference'.

Discussed the Flu and Covid vaccination programme. It was raised that our yesterday clinic had delays with covid stock, but thankfully we were able to continue the clinic. Over the course of 3 clinic days, we vaccinated over 3000 patients both with Covid and Flu vaccinations.

2 | First Contact Physiotherapists

Neil Gregory and Lindsay Ashton attend and gave an overview of the service.

The service diagnoses and accesses, but do not treat. Instead, this is referred to Secondary Care.

It was queried whether the reception teams are aware of the service, which we mentioned all the communications we use.

The service compliments to the GPs, by allowing extra capacity and supporting the GPs with specialist queries.

Waiting times in Secondary Care can be 8-10 weeks, whereas our average is 2 weeks.

3 Feedback on practice websites

Some Hope Farm patients were not aware of newsletters and how they are distributed. Some practices do not have newsletters, and it was mentioned having them is very useful, both electronic and physically available.

It was raised that some practices have staff lists, while others do not. Also, some have their email clearly labelled, why others do not. An example was someone wanted to contact the practice manager/deputy or someone specific, however this is not clear on the website. That way patients could contact who they need with useful information.
