NHS App information for our patients

The NHS App gives you a simple and secure way to access a range of NHS services. You can download the NHS App on your smartphone or tablet via the Google play or App store. You can also access the same services in a web browser by logging in through the NHS website.

You must be aged thirteen or over to use the NHS App. You also need to be registered with a GP surgery in England or the Isle of Man.

What you can do with the NHS App:

You need to prove who you are to get full access to the NHS App, and you can do this yourself via the app or with the help of your GP. With full access you can:

- Order repeat prescriptions and nominate a pharmacy where you would like to collect them.
- View your GP health record to see information like your allergies and medicines (if your GP has given you access to your detailed medical record, you can also see information like test results)
- Register your organ donation decision.
- Choose how the NHS uses your data.
- View your NHS number.
- Use NHS 111 online to answer questions and get instant advice or medical help near you

Musculoskeletal Practitioner at Uppingham Surgery

A Musculoskeletal (MSK) Practitioner is a healthcare professional, typically a physiotherapist, with specialized skills in diagnosing and managing conditions related to the musculoskeletal system (muscles, bones, joints, and nerves).

Our Musculoskeletal Practitioner, Alex, can help patients with musculoskeletal issues such as pain in the back, bones, joints, or muscles.

They can provide comprehensive care, which may include:

- Assessment and diagnosis: Identifying the cause of the problem and determining the best course of action.
- Treatment and management: Providing advice on self-care, exercise, and other therapies.
- Referrals: Referring patients to other specialists, such as radiologists, surgeons, or other practitioners, when necessary.

By seeing one of our Musculoskeletal Practitioners, you will get quicker access to specialised care, leading to faster diagnosis, treatment, and recovery. They can also help to improve patient outcomes and reduce GP workload.

Have you heard of Homeshare Leicestershire?

Homeshare Leicestershire is a not-for-profit organisation established in 2022 to support people with long term health conditions and older adults to maintain their independence at home whilst creating well maintained and affordable shared accommodation opportunities.

Homeshare Leicestershire is staffed by Social Workers and Community Workers with decades of experience safeguarding the welfare of vulnerable adults and young people.

Homeshare Leicestershire charges home sharers (people who move into a homeowner's property), a monthly service fee on commencement, and for the duration of the home share placement. The fee covers the cost of all initial safety, safeguarding and reference checks, initial matching and due diligence process, and regular ongoing support and assistance throughout the home share for both the homeowner and the home sharer.
