## TOTAL TRIAGE - THE JOURNEY SO FAR

As you are all aware, from October 2024 onwards, all of our GP practices moved over to the new Total Triage appointment system.



Since moving over to Total Triage, our telephone wait times have reduced by 54% and the amount of calls we receive has reduced by 40%. More calls are being answered since we have implemented the new appointment system and compared with this time last year, average wait times have reduced from 32 minutes to 14 minutes and we have gone from receiving 113,425 calls to 68,000 (data refers to Jan-Apr 2024 compared with Jan-Apr 2025).

Over the last two months across our eight practices, 36 patients did not attend (DNA) their same-day appointment and 85 patients did not attend their routine appointment. Had these patients, contacted us to cancel their appointment, we may have been able to offer them to other patients.

That's 121 wasted appointments in total. Please make sure you get in touch when needing to cancel an appointment whether that's via the phoneline option or online using Total Triage.

## PHARMACIES NOW OFFER ORAL CONTRACEPTION

Women across the Black Country can now get their supply of oral contraception (known as the pill) for the first time directly from their pharmacist, rather than from their GP or a sexual health clinic – without the need for an appointment. This aims to increase choice for women in the ways in which they can access contraception.

Have you signed up to the <u>NHS App</u> yet? If not, then it's about time!



With the app, you can order repeat prescriptions easily at the touch of a button. You can also access the Total Triage appointment form as well as viewing your health record, test results, and more – all in one place.
