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Online Consultations

Via our practice website you can submit online consultations. This could be an admin query (e.g. Fit note request, wanting test results or a letter), or a NON URGENT medical query.

Please note this is NOT a form of medical triage and the purpose of these medical online forms are to help facilitate simple clinical requests that would not normally require an appointment (e.g. requesting a blood test). You may then be asked for more information via text e.g. photos.

However, if on review of the query an appointment is recommended you will be directed to the usual pathways for this.

The online forms are reviewed by a staff member within 3 working days.

Pharmacy First

Local pharmacies now offer the Pharmacy First service, giving advice and if needed, NHS medications to treat seven common health conditions – without needing a GP appointment. You can walk into any of your local pharmacies for advice.

Sore throat	5 years and over
