Get Advice

Pharmacy First: The Pharmacy First Services was launched on 31st January 2024 to provide patients with advice on minor illnesses and medicines.

The service offers quick and easy access to advice on conditions including Acute Otitis (for

patients aged 1-17 years),
Impetigo (for patients aged 1 year
and over), infected insect bites
(for patients aged 1 year and
over), Shingles (for patients aged
18 years and over), Sinusitis (for
patients 12 and over), sore
throats (patients 5 years and
over) and uncomplicated Urinary
Tract Infections (for female
patients aged 16-64 years).

Pharmacists can also provide direct access to some prescription-only medicines without the need to see a GP.

Pharmacists have private consulting rooms so you can discuss your issues in private.

They can also refer you to a GP or other healthcare professional if needed and following your appointment, the Pharmacist will notify your GP.

NHS App: You can use the NHS App to check your symptoms and get instant advice, book appointments and order repeat prescriptions.

Patient Participation Group (PPG)
