The Scams Awareness & Aftercare Project:

The Scams Awareness & Aftercare project offers:

Awareness raising sessions to groups of people.
The sessions are tailored to suit any size of group,
and we offer them to groups of older people,
volunteers and people who work with older people.
Our focus is to provide relevant information and
top tips to keep yourselves and loved ones safe
from different types of fraud.



- 1:1 sessions. For those people who may not belong to a group or would prefer a more personal discussion we will meet you, in your home, or place you feel comfortable, and talk through your specific concerns around keeping safe. This can be a particularly valuable opportunity if you have had a near miss.
- A monthly Scams Bulletin where we will provide information about current frauds, do deep dives into fraud trends and update you on local frauds.
- An aftercare service for people who have been victims of fraud. We provide practical and emotional support to victims, helping them to regain their confidence and rejoin their community.

Here are some recent frauds to look out for:



We have had numerous reports across Cheshire and Greater Manchester that criminals are targeting car park ticket machines. Be careful if scanning QR codes, you may think you are paying for parking but actually lining criminals' wallets. Additionally in some instances criminals are posing as car park attendants, complete with chip and pin machines. Always pay at the machine or use the approved Parking App. Cheshire East Council have recently changed to the RingGo app.



Cheshire Police are warning that they have noticed an increase in the amount of scam calls being reported concerning banking fraud. Criminals are posing as Police Officers requesting help to investigate local bank branches. They may ask you to withdraw cash or transfer money into a 'safe account' as part of their investigations. They may arrange for a courier to come and collect the cash, or to take you to a bank branch. The Police will NEVER ask you to withdraw money. Always hang up and contact your bank's fraud department on 159 to report any suspicious activity.



We continue to receive reports that people are receiving text messages offering a Winter Fuel Payment or an Annual Allowance by the Government. These texts refer to payments/allowances that are not official government schemes. Remember, never click on a link or download an attachment. Criminals are simply trying to get your personal or financial details. Report suspicious text messages, for free, to 7726.
