Introduction

You have been given this pack as you have been identified as an unpaid carer, what does that mean you may ask?

An unpaid carer is a person who provides unpaid support to a partner, child, relative or friend who couldn't manage to live independently or whose health and wellbeing would deteriorate without this support.

If you support someone who normally lives in Herefordshire then you are a carer and are entitled to information support and advice regarding your caring role. You may also be entitled to financial support.

Dementia Matters Here:

Description:

Dementia Matters Here support people affected by dementia and their families in Herefordshire. They offer different services for anyone caring for a loved one with dementia, including a fortnightly carers' support group and buddying service, where you can access peer support, information and advice.

Dementia Matters Here is an independent Herefordshire charity, which supports people affected by dementia, to remain a part of their community for as long as possible.

We develop community support initiatives, work with Herefordshire Dementia Action Alliance, organisations and third sector groups to develop dementia friendly communities. We also offer education and training and raise awareness to reduce stigma.

We provide a number of different community support services in Herefordshire, including:

Telephone Support Line: Available Monday to Friday from 9am to 5pm on 01432 804480.

One to One Support: This dedicated support helps you to adjust to change, access opportunities, advice and information.

Buddying Service: Offering phone calls or visits from trained volunteers for a chat, or to access community opportunities for people with dementia or their carer.

Online Carers' Support Group: A fortnightly support group for those caring for someone with dementia, to enable them to access peer support, information and advice.

Health & Wellbeing Team:

The Health & Wellbeing Team are part of your GP Surgery. They consist of a team of Social Prescribers, Health & Wellbeing Coaches and a Mental Health Practitioner. They can help you with Signposting to Services within your local area, weightloss and motivational coaching and low level Mental Health approaches.

Healthy Lifestyle Service:

We offer free and confidential support to anyone aged over 16, living in Herefordshire or registered with a Herefordshire GP.

We can support people to make healthier changes to their lifestyle, particularly focusing on:

Healthy eating

Weight management

Increasing Physical activity

Reducing alcohol

Stopping smoking

We can help people identify how their behaviours in these areas may be affecting their health

We do this through a behavioural change approach, supporting individuals to create a personal health plan to make changes to improve their health and wellbeing.
