Christmas Closure

The good news is that the surgery is only closed on the 3 public holidays.

25th / 26th December and 1st January.

How to access support if someone is unwell over Christmas?

There are various ways you can access healthcare when the surgery is closed.

Pharmacy first for some minor conditions. You will need to find a pharmacist that is open over the Christmas period** but they can prescribe medication for

- impetigo (aged 1 year and over)
- infected insect bites (aged 1 year and over)
- earache (aged 1 to 17 years)
- sore throat (aged 5 years and over)
- sinusitis (aged 12 years and over)
- urinary tract infections (UTIs) (women aged 16 to 64 years)
- shingles (aged 18 years and over)

** **Benjamins** in Ross is open 25.12.25 10am – 1pm **Boots** in Ross is open on 26.12.25 and 01.01.2026 10am – 4pm **Drybrook Pharmacy** (GL17 9JA) will be open from 12 noon to 2pm on 25th/26th December and New Year's Day.

Asda Pharmacy Hereford is open 26.12.25 and 01.01.2026 10am – 4pm

NHS 111 can help if you think you need medical help right now. You can access it online, on the app or by calling 111. Use online / app in the first instance for people aged 5 or over and call 111 for help for a child under 5.

You can also use the service for general health information, mental health support if your GP is unavailable and help in finding an emergency dentist. It is important to be aware that they can also help you obtain an emergency supply of regularly prescribed medication, should you run out.

Visit the minor injury unit (MIU) based in Cinderford (GL14 3HY). You can use this service if you live in Herefordshire, you do not need an appt. but it may help to call 111 first and they can refer you or arrange an appt. which may help with the waiting time. At the MIU they can treat

- Cuts, grazes, and wounds
- Sprains and strains
- Minor burns
- Minor eye injuries
- Broken bones (check with 111 first if you think you may need an X-ray as the radiology dept. is only open at certain times)

Call 999 for emergencies, please remember the service is likely to be busy over the Christmas period, so consider other resources first if appropriate.
