Dear Fellow Lilyville Patients,

Now summer is over, we are preparing for our next **Friends** meeting when we hope as many of you as possible are able to join us at Lilyville: **TUESDAY 1**ST **OCTOBER, 5.30-7.00pm.** All Lilyville patients are welcome to these meetings – it's a chance to get to know the practice better AND to have your say in how the practice works.

GP COLLECTIVE ACTION

You may have heard in the news over the summer that GPs were balloted in June about taking collective action over their underfunded and overstretched contract — with a resounding YES as the outcome. At Lilyville, GPs decided that the action they would take was to reduce the availability of PATCHES — so it is now not available to patients from 12.30-1.30pm. This is a very limited action (and there is nowhere in the country where GPs are on strike) – **GPs are very reluctant to take action that will affect patients**. But, as the British Medical Association leaders argue, this industrial action is about 'safety, security and hope' – underfunding of GP services is damaging to patients. We need to remember that only 8.4% of total NHS funding is spent on primary care which is a historic low. And this is where about 90% of initial contact with the NHS is with one's GP practice.



And at the same time, GPs are seeing **more patients than ever**. In fact, it is not surprising that, faced with ever-increasing work demands, that many GPs retire early because of 'burn-out'.

Despite the increasing pressures, as Dr Weston-Price told us at an earlier Friends meeting, at Lilyville 84-90% of routine appointments

take place within 2 weeks; and triage is always done by a fully-trained GP – despite all the pressures.

And there's also the new RSV jab to protect **older people** and **pregnant women** against the respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) – if you've had a message from Lilyville or the NHS about this, please do follow up! We can expect the Covid jabs later in the autumn!
