## Do you have diabetes?

#### Diabetes MyWay can help.

This is a free service for people with diabetes available across NHS Scotland.

My Diabetes My Way is a website for people with diabetes and their carers. It contains information resources that can help you understand more about your diabetes and explains how you can more effectively manage the condition.

In addition, you can also access:

- Access your diabetes records
- Data collected from your GP notes
- Hospital diabetes clinic records
- Eye screening service and lab blood tests

The service is not a replacement for your normal care, but helps you to monitor your results before, during and after contacts with your healthcare team.

## Fitness to Fly

#### **Pregnancy**

The midwifery service will no longer issue Fitness to Fly letters; they will now issue a standard template letter which confirms a patient as pregnant, their EDD and that they are attending for ante-natal care.

This is accepted by most airlines.

#### Diazepam

We no longer prescribe diazepam for flying.

This is a clinical decision made on the guidelines from the BMS and GMC.

Who do you need an appointment with?

### **Urine / Kidney Infections**

**UTIs – Signposting to Pharmacy** 

The service is only available for females aged 16yrs or over.

#### UTIs - Treatment by the practice

Male patients are seen by the practice. Other exclusion criteria would be:

- Recurrent infections (more than 2 in 6 months)
- Pregnancy
- Patients with catheters
- Immunocompromised
- Any blood in the urine
- Pain in lower back/temperature
- Symptoms longer than 7 days

## Surgery abroad without NHS referral

NHS Scotland does not recommend choosing to pay to travel abroad for surgery as part of a packaged holiday. This is sometimes called surgical or cosmetic tourism.
