
Daffodil Standards

Healthwatch Norfolk recently conducted a survey at each of our Vida Healthcare sites, collecting information first hand and via patient feedback to produce their feedback/ engagement reports. Below are some of the overall comments present within the report:

Carole Brown Health Centre

Survey Rating: 4.3/5

Overall, people were pleased with the care they received at Carole Brown Health Centre, highlighting how helpful and polite staff were. However, many people raised concerns over difficulties in making appointments, particularly on-the-day appointments.

Gayton Road Health Centre

Survey Rating: 4.4/5

Overall, people were pleased with the care they received from Gayton Road Health Centre, and many emphasised how helpful staff were and what good care they provide. However, there was mixed feedback regarding making appointments with multiple people reporting that they often had to wait a long time for an appointment.

St Augustine's Surgery

Survey Rating: 4.8/5

Overall, people felt happy with the care they received at St Augustine's surgery, with people praising the friendly and helpful attitudes of staff, and the good parking facilities. There was a concern however about how accessible the use of an online booking system is to make an appointment. Although it should be noted the surgery does allow patients to both call the surgery and visit the reception desk in the surgery to make appointments.

Hunstanton Medical Practice

Survey Rating: 4.2/5

Overall, people seemed happy with their experiences of care at Hunstanton Medical Practice, with patients praising staff members. However, it was noted that some people found it difficult to book appointments and that there could be long wait times.

COVID-19 Vaccinations

The Autumn 2025 covid vaccination programme will target patients who are at the highest risk of serious illness to protect the most vulnerable.

This campaign, there are strict guidelines to be adhered to as defined in the UK Health Security Agency's information on immunisation against infectious disease.

Eligibility has been reduced considerably.


Please Note: If you were eligible in previous campaigns, you may not be eligible and meet the criteria for this Autumn 2025 campaign.

Eligible patients are:

- Adults aged 75 years and over.
- Residents in a care home for older adults.
- Individuals aged 6 months and over who are severely immunosuppressed, as defined in tables 3 and 4 of the COVID-19 chapter of the Green Book, the UK Health Security Agency's information on immunisation against infectious disease.

With effect from 1st October 2025 Vida Healthcare will be undertaking the administration of covid vaccines to our Care Homes and Housebound patients.

There will be a covid vaccination centre in Conduit Street in Kings Lynn.

systmconnect powered by systmone

SystmConnect is an online consultation system now being used across all Vida sites. Unfortunately we had to replace the PATCHS system, this is the solution we will be using now.

With the help of SystmConnect your health questions are sent to our doctors, who then triage and advise our care navigation team which steps to take next, such as booking in an appointment or sending for blood tests.

We will acknowledge and update your request within 24 working hours but a full response may take longer and will be triaged on a priority basis.

On any given day we have a capacity set for each request type. Once the capacity for the given request type has been reached, no further requests will be available for that request type until the following day. If you have an URGENT medical enquiry, please telephone the practice.

From 01/07/2025 to 26/08/2025 we have dealt with almost 1,200 SystmConnect requests. Please see below a breakdown of the types of requests we have received so far:

Assessment and Injection Therapy Service

As of 1st September, and as part of the Musculoskeletal (MSK) Pathway Transformation led by the Norfolk and Waveney ICB (Integrated Care Board), the Vida Assessment and Injection Service (AITS) has ceased operations.

The ICB have stated that this change once fully established, will be fully standardised to ensure equitable access to assessment and treatment for all patients across Norfolk and Waveney.

Unfortunately, this means that Vida is unable to provide this service. We have been advised that therapeutic joint injections should be managed within general practice.

You should check with your GP if they are able to provide this and where they cannot, they will be able to outline your options, which may be for example getting a referral to the new MSK service.

If you are unable to obtain this service and/or are unhappy with the new arrangements/options you are being offered, we would advise you to discuss this with the ICB, their contact details are as follows:

What happens when you quit?

After 2 to 12 weeks

Blood will be pumping through to your heart and muscles much better because your circulation will have improved.



After 3 to 9 months

Any coughs, wheezing or breathing problems will be improving as your lung function increases by up to 10%.



After 1 year

Great news! Your risk of heart attack will have halved compared with a smoker's.



After 10 years

More great news! Your risk of death from lung cancer will have halved compared with a smoker's.
