



What is Ambulatory Wound Clinic?

We are a new service which has been introduced in February 2021. We are a service provided by MPFT, working in collaboration with other healthcare providers to give you the highest standard of care.

We see patients who are not housebound and who are referred to the clinic by another health professional for wound care.

We are a small team of nurses and health care assistants that bring a wealth of knowledge and experience to the service. We aim to provide you with continuity and professionalism throughout your care journey.

What services does the clinic provide?

The service includes management of :

- ❖ Patients with acute, chronic or complex wounds.
- ❖ Leg ulcers, diabetic foot ulcers and pressure ulcers.
- ❖ Post-surgical wounds including suture and clip removal.
- ❖ Non healing wounds.
- ❖ Wounds that may require specialist therapies and management.
- ❖ Referral to other specialist healthcare professionals if required.
- ❖ Advice on signs and symptoms of infection and sepsis.
- ❖ Information and promotion of self-care.
- ❖ Health promotion including advice on diet, exercise, support to stop smoking and general skin care advice which will aid with wound healing.

The clinic provides a holistic assessment, advice and support on all aspects of existing wounds and their care, as well as preventative wound care advice.

The service embraces adults of all age ranges, ethnic groups and clients with a variety of medical conditions that are non housebound.
