1.	Introduction to the Meeting (JH)

	HY Advised the way GPs sign off requests on Anima will be different but will stay the same for patients.

	JH advised it is easier to access Anima via the practice websites rather than trying to log in via the Anima website.	
	GC advised that patients are now being sent satisfaction surveys after each patient appointment and that the feedback shows that a significant number of patients respond with favourable comments about the efficiency, speed and ease of use when using Anima.	

3. Phlebotomy (HY/JC)

HY gave an update on requesting blood tests post cyber-attack on Synnovis.

- Synnovis diverted our blood tests to Croydon/Kingston.
- Synnovis were only processing hospital blood tests.
- Synnovis now up and running again in the PRUH.
- There is a significant backlog of test requests.
- We have raised this with the CCG as an ongoing issue and expressed our dissatisfaction with the situation as routine tests requested in June 2024 are only being processed now. Tests requested now will be processed in February 2025.
- The CCG have not provided a solution for GP surgeries regarding funding of extra clinics requires to help clear the backlog.
- We are still waiting to hear from Synnovis about how this problem will be dealt with.
- We have found it difficult at both surgeries trying to cope with patient expectations, disappointment and anger but we can only work with what we have.

HY suggested we raise these issues at PCN PPG level to write a letter to Synnovis/CCG. JH to liaise with GC about this.

4. Pharmacy First

HY advised that this service is available to patients who may need assistance with certain minor ailments but which do not need to see a GP about. It helps reduce the number of GP appointments and increases income for pharmacies.

These minor ailments can now be dealt with by Pharmacists: Ear, throat, sinus, eye infections, shingles and uncomplicated urinary tract infections (in women).

Pharmacists can give prescriptions for these but a patient cannot walk into a pharmacy to ask for a prescription without having a referral raised by the GP surgery.

This is not the most effective process as it still means that a patient will have to go to the GP surgery to get a referral and then go to the pharmacy. It would be better if the patient simply went to the pharmacy for a prescription but this is the NHS England requirement.

5. Medical Records (JC)

Do GP surgeries still keep paper records?

HY advised patient medical details are held on a computer system we use called 'EMIS' (Electronic Medical Information Systems) which are linked in some ways with 'Epic' (Electronic Health Record System) which is the system
